SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE

For the week of May 31-June 6, 2020

"3 ADMINS SURVIVE FURNACE! KING BACKS DOWN ON WORSHIP DECREE"

GETTING STARTED

To the facilitator: As your group begins, use this section to introduce the topic. If possible, give a brief recap of the sermon.

Share a memorable point, a spiritual lesson, a personal application, a question, or something that challenged you from the sermon last Sunday.

What three (3) things do you do first the moment you wake up? Can you trace the reason or the source of your habits?

GROUP DISCUSSION

- 1. Read Daniel 3:1-15. The phrase "fall down" occurs four times in chapter 3 and each time is joined to the word "worship." What does that say about the role of our actions to our worship? Do you agree with what Pastor Nic said that "Worship is what we do, and worship is who we are"?
- 2. Discuss. Why do you think Nebuchadnezzar sets up this impressive golden statue? What do you think was his motivation or reason for building such a huge and expensive idol?
- 3. Share. The phrase "set up" is repeated several times in this chapter referring to Nebuchadnezzar setting up the image, implying that it was the king who was behind it. Can you think of parallels in our time where people "set up" something and demand allegiance to it? What are some of these things that we see around us and in our culture? What might it mean for you not to bow down?
- 4. What do you make of Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego's response in Daniel 3:16-18? What stood out to you (e.g. in terms of what they said, their motivations and fears, their trust, their actions and decisions, etc.)?
- 5. Pastor Nic in the sermon talked about the "Unpredictability of God." Why does this sound negative? What is something positive that should come out in the Christian who understands and accepts this?

- 6. Read Daniel 3:19-30. When you consider the story of the entire chapter, what does this tell us about God and about living as people in exile? How does the story intersect with your life?
- 7. In the sermon, Pastor Nic shared the principle "order communicates priority" as a way to be intentional about putting God first. Share some practical ways that this principle can help you to be more intentional in your worship of God.
