SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE

For the week of December 6-12, 2020 "JOSEPH'S SURPRISE"

GETTING STARTED

To the facilitator: Use this section to introduce the topic. If possible, give a brief recap of the sermon.

Describe using one word what you know of as a very interesting detail about Joseph (the father of Jesus).

GROUP DISCUSSION

Read Matthew 1:18-25.

- 1. How did Matthew tell us about the human situation of Joseph and Mary? What did the phrase "Mary was found to be pregnant" suggest about the whole scenario? What about the phrase "before they came together"?
- What was Joseph considering in regards to Mary and why would he be justified in doing this? (See Deuteronomy 24:1.) What does this say about his character? What does this teach us about how we can respond or make decisions in a godly way especially when somebody hurts us?
- 3. Obeying God is not always easy. From a human perspective, what would it "cost" Joseph to go ahead and marry Mary? Can you recall a time when you were certain that God was nudging you toward this kind of obedience? How did you respond? What went through your mind as you made the decision?
- 4. "When everything is unclear in life, simply obey what is clear." How does Joseph's story encourage you to cooperate with God even when he wants you to do something very difficult? What is the role of the Bible in your decision making?
- 5. Jesus could have appeared to people in any way he chose to. Read Hebrews 4:14-15. How is Jesus' identity as Immanuel, God With Us, confirmed in these verses? How has this truth about who Jesus is comfort you lately?

6. What does verse 21 say about the purpose of Jesus' incarnation? Why would this be very different from the expectations of the Jews at that time? In what way(s) do we make the same mistake by focusing on the temporal instead of the eternal? What kind of a Messiah is Jesus?
