## **SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE**

For the week of January 16-22, 2022 "MORE THAN WORDS"

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## **GETTING STARTED**

To the facilitator: Use this section to introduce the topic. If possible, give a brief recap of the sermon.

## **GROUP DISCUSSION**

Read Matthew 1:1-17

- 1. What was your initial reaction when you read the list of names? Which names immediately stood out for you?
- When you consider God's words to David in 2 Sam 7:12-16, why do you think are God's promises to David still so significant for us today? What does these promises tell us about the character of God?
- 3. The Old Testament and all of history revolved around a King who would come Jesus. How could this truth shape the way we view the world? How should it change our desires and values? How should it affect our priorities?
- 4. Review the call of God to Abraham (Gen 12:1-5) and ponder over the following questions relation to Abraham's call: (a) What did God tell Abraham? (b) What did God promise Abraham? (c) How old was Abraham when was given to him? If you were Abraham, what would you have felt if you heard God saying the same things he said to Abraham to you? How would you respond?
- 5. Identify the names of the women who are in this list (1:1-17). What characteristics of these women make them stand out? Which among these women can you relate the most?
- 6. Why is it significant that Jesus' genealogy include moral outcasts and ethnically diverse people? Why is that good news for us?

7. What are some truths that God wants you to learn this week? How should these truths impact you today as a disciple of Christ? As you face the uncertainties of life?
