## **SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE**

For the week of April 17-23, 2022 "THE SUFFERING SERVANT"

### **GETTING STARTED**

To the facilitator: Use this section to introduce the topic. If possible, give a brief recap of the sermon.

Share a memorable point, a spiritual lesson, a personal application, a question, or something that challenged you from the sermon last Sunday.

How would you feel if someone else took responsibility and the consequences for a major mistake you made? Would you be willing to let this happen? Why or why not?

## **GROUP DISCUSSION**

Read Isaiah 52:13-53:12.

- List as many characteristics of the Suffering Servant as you can from this passage.
   What parts of Jesus' life do these prophecies make you think of?
- 2. Why would God choose someone as undesirable as the Suffering Servant to bring about the salvation of man (53:2)? How does this description compare to your perception of Jesus?
- When faced with suffering and rejection in our own lives, why is it a comfort to know that Jesus knows better than anyone what it's like to suffer and be rejected? (See also John 15:18-19.)
- 4. Do you see yourself included in the phrase in Isaiah 53:6, "All of us like sheep have gone astray?" Share a brief testimony of how Christ has been like a shepherd to you?
- 5. Isaiah 53:10 says "But Yahweh was pleased to crush Him" (LSB). Why would God treat the Suffering Servant in this way? What did he do to bear God's punishment? What did we do to deserve his grace?
- 6. Review the different ways where God's mercy and grace are shown throughout this chapter. How should we respond and live our lives in view of what God has done for us?

7. Jesus was terribly humiliated through his death on the cross. Share and pray together about situations of humbling that you (or others you know) have experienced in order to faithfully serve God and others.
