SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE

For the week of August 20-26, 2023 "WHEN GOD SEEMS ABSENT"

GETTING STARTED

To the facilitator: Use this section to introduce the topic. If possible, give a brief recap of the sermon.

Share a memorable point, a spiritual lesson, a personal application, a question, or something that challenged you from the sermon last Sunday.

If you could give your younger self advice about expectations versus reality, what funny piece of wisdom would you share?

GROUP DISCUSSION

Read Habakkuk 1:1-11

- 1. What do we know about the historical context of Habakkuk's message? What was happening in Judah during that time? In what way were Habakkuk's concerns and questions relevant to the people of his time? Can you think of examples from recent history or current events that mirror the questions that Habakkuk was grappling with?
- 2. Habakkuk feels like God is not responding to his cries for help. How does his questions and doubts resonate with our own struggles to understand God's ways? Have you ever experienced a situation where you felt like God was silent or distant? How did you handle it?
- 3. In verse 5, God declares that he will do something that the people wouldn't believe even if they were told. What do you think went through Habakkuk's mind when he these words? What character and nature of God do you see in this statement?
- 4. The Babylonians' pride is emphasized in these verses 6-11. How does their arrogance intersect with the concept of God's sovereignty and their role in his plan? How can human pride hinder our capability to fully submit to God's purposes in our lives?
- 5. How can we develop the ability to see beyond the surface of events and recognize God's underlying purposes, as Habakkuk had to do with the Babylonians? What practices or perspectives can help us view challenges and difficulties as opportunities for growth and learning?

- 6. How comfortable are you with questioning God when you encounter challenges, injustices, or difficulties in your life? Has there been a recent situation that caused you to question God's plan? How did you handle it and how did God respond to you?
- 7. In what ways can Habakkuk's interaction with God serve as a model for your own prayer life and communication with God during times of confusion or questioning? Are there other biblical figures who experienced doubts and uncertainties that you can relate to and learn from?

8. **NEXT STEPS**

God the Father did what was right to save us by sending Jesus. You can trust him to do the right thing in your life.
