SERMON NOTES

Looking good is not the same as being changed.

God is not looking at your feed, he's looking at your heart.

I. THE FOCUS OF RELIGION - WHAT PEOPLE SEE.

Looking faithful is not the same as being faithful.

Just because your life looks holy doesn't mean your heart is holy.

God isn't impressed by your highlight reel, he's invested in your heart reality.

II. THE FAILURE OF THE HEART - WHAT GOD SEES.

The danger of hypocrisy isn't in putting on a show but in thinking the show is enough.

We are all hypocrites. The difference between a hypocrite and a believer is that one uses the mask to deceive others, and the other asks God to remove it.

III. THE FIX OF THE GOSPEL - WHAT JESUS GIVES.

Jesus didn't come to clean the outside, he came to cleanse the inside.

Jesus - the only One who was ever truly clean - willingly became defiled to make us clean.



SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE For the week of July 28-August 3, 2025 "WHEN JESUS LOOKS AT THE HEART"

Getting Started

To the facilitator: Use this section to introduce the topic. If possible, give a brief recap of the sermon.

Share a memorable point, a spiritual lesson, a personal application, a question, or something that challenged you from the sermon last Sunday.

If social media disappeared tomorrow, what would you miss the most, and what might you *not* miss?

Group Discussion

Read Mark 7:1-23.

- 1. What were the Pharisees so upset about in Mark 7:1–5? Why did they believe the disciples were doing something wrong? How does understanding the tradition of ceremonial washing help us see where they were coming from? Is tradition inherently wrong?
- 2. What are some examples of religious or church traditions today that, while not bad in themselves, can sometimes overshadow the heart of worship or obedience? How can we tell when a tradition is helping our faith versus hindering it? Have you ever had to "unlearn" a tradition in order to follow God more faithfully? What helped you make that shift?
- 3. What does it mean to honor God with lips but have a heart far from him? How is this hypocrisy? How does that help you understand what Jesus is really confronting? Can you think of modern examples where people honor God with their words but not their actions? How do you recognize that in yourself?
- 4. What was "Corban" and how did it allow people to bypass the commandment to "Honor your father and mother"? Can you think of any ways in our modern context, even within Christian circles, where "spiritual" activities or human preferences might inadvertently lead us to neglect clear biblical responsibilities?

- 5. Jesus makes a statement about defilement in Mark 7:14-16, then explains it further to his disciples (verses 17-23). Why was this considered a radical shift from the common thinking of the day? In what ways can performance replace authenticity in *your* walk with God?
- 6. Jesus lists several sins that come "from within" in verses 21–23. Read through that list slowly. Which of those do you think are most commonly overlooked or minimized in today's culture, or even in the church? Why do you think it's so easy to focus on managing external behaviors instead of addressing internal brokenness?
- 7. Read 1 Samuel 16:7 and Ezekiel 36:26. How do these verses reinforce the message of Mark 7? What does it look like for someone to receive a "new heart" from God? How would you describe the difference between outward religiosity and inner transformation in *your* own life?

Next Steps

God is not looking at your feed, he's looking at your heart.

- I will confess ways that I've been performing instead of pursuing Jesus personally.
- I will focus on heart transformation, not just habit formation.
- I will prioritize God's Word and not human tradition.
- I will surrender my heart to Jesus.

Closing the Session

Close the session by taking the time to pray for one another. Consider the following as you pray:

- Pray for a heart that flows out of a love for God, not with masks, but with authenticity.
- Pray for relationships to grow with other Christ-followers, that you will encourage and care for one another.
- Pray for your unsaved family, friends, and loved ones.
- Pray for protection, provision, healing and comfort for everyone who's going through physical, emotional, mental and spiritual pain.
