SERMON NOTES

It's not whether you'll live under authority. The question is which authority do you choose?

I. THE CHALLENGE: WHEN AUTHORITY IS THREATENED

Jesus was such a threat that he united enemies.

When someone with real authority shows up, people with pretend authority panic.

The question "By what authority?" is only asked by people who don't want to submit to the authority.

When Jesus's real authority confronts our assumed authority over our own lives, we have a choice: submit or challenge.

II. THE COUNTER: WHEN WISDOM EXPOSES TREACHERY

Integrity dies when you care more about managing your image than pursuing truth.

Sometimes the most powerful thing you can do is let people reveal themselves.

Following Jesus isn't intellectually difficult. It's just expensive. It costs us our autonomy. Our pride. Our carefully constructed image. Our right to do whatever we want.

III. THE CLAIM: AUTHORITY THAT CANNOT BE DENIED

Jesus's authority doesn't increase when we acknowledge it, and it doesn't decrease when we deny it.

Jesus is Lord whether you call him Lord or not.



SMALL GROUP DISCUSSION GUIDE For the week of December 1-7, 2025 "THE QUESTION OF AUTHORITY"

Getting Started

To the facilitator: Use this section to introduce the topic. If possible, give a brief recap of the sermon.

Share a memorable point, a spiritual lesson, a personal application, a question, or something that challenged you from the sermon last Sunday.

Tell about a time you had to give a very careful answer because you knew any response would get you in trouble or would be misinterpreted. What was the situation?

Group Discussion - Read Mark 11:27-33.

- 1. Why do you think the chief priests, scribes, and elders approached Jesus together instead of separately? What does their question "By what authority are you doing these things?" reveal about what was really bothering them? If you had been in the crowd watching this confrontation, what do you think would have been going through your mind?
- 2. Why was Jesus' reply in verses 29–30 such a brilliant response to their trap? How does Jesus' question expose what was really in their hearts? When has God asked you a question (through Scripture, a sermon, or conviction) that revealed what was really going on inside you?
- 3. The leaders discuss their answer privately before responding. What does their calculation process tell us about their priorities? The passage says they "feared the people." How does fear of what others think keep us from being honest about what we know is true? Can you think of a time when you said something equivalent to "I don't know," though you actually did know but you just weren't ready to act on it?
- 4. The leaders' final answer, "We do not know," is clearly evasive. Why do you think they chose that response, and how does fear of consequences shape their decision? How can fear (e.g. fear of change, fear of loss, fear of people, etc.) affect our willingness to obey God? What is one area where fear might be keeping you from honesty or obedience?

5. The leaders reject Jesus' authority not because they lacked evidence but because surrender would cost them something. What do you think they feared losing most? How does the cost of following Jesus sometimes tempt us to protect ourselves instead of surrender? Which part of following Jesus feels most costly to you right now?

6. The religious leaders' refusal to answer Jesus' question reveals a disconnect between their public role and private conviction. Where do you see similar tensions in your own life, between what you profess and what you truly believe or live out? How does the gospel address the gap between our outward actions and inward motives?

Next Steps

It's not whether you'll live under authority. The question is which authority do you choose?

- Question Humbly: I will pause before reacting critically and instead ask God to reveal any pride, fear, or hidden motives behind my doubts or questions.
- Choose Truth: When faced with a hard choice between looking good and doing what's right, I'll choose honesty even if it costs me approval or comfort.
- **Submit Fully:** I'll identify one area where I've been resisting Jesus' authority and take concrete steps to align my actions with his Lordship.
- Speak Boldly: I'll look for opportunities to gently but clearly share truth.

Closing the Session

Close the session by taking the time to *pray for one another*. Consider the following as you pray:

- Pray for Jesus to expose anything that keeps you from following him fully.
- Pray for relationships to grow with other Christ-followers, that you will encourage and care for one another.
- Pray for your unsaved family, friends, and loved ones.
- Pray for protection, provision, healing and comfort for everyone who's going through physical, emotional, mental and spiritual pain.
